The members of the Faculty of Economics, Saitama University, participated in the International Workshop, “Impacts of Globalisation of East, South and Southeast Asian Countries” hosted by the Center for International Economics, Faculty of Economics, Chulalongkorn University in Bangkok, Thailand on 23 August 2019.

The Workshop covered a wide range of cross-cutting and inter-disciplinary topics to explore prescriptions for achieving economic growth in the long-run, improving the well-being and strengthening political and economic regional co-operation. The topics discussed in the Workshop included the economic impact of the China – the US trade conflict, the progress of globalisation in the region and its key challenges; evolution of ASEAN financial integration; impact of the involvement in global value chains on the Asian economies; and challenges of human capital development of the countries in the region (please see the Appendix for the detailed program).
